- Commit to improve well-being of the students around the world*


1.4 Adhere to Professional Ethics


2.2 Demonstrate Effective Intervention

- Utilize information technology and data for assessment and intervention skilfully and ethically

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
- Demonstrate presentation, mediation, negotiation and persuasion skill*
